

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-20

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING
CHAPTER 5, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY OF THE
REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF
BELMAR SECTION 2.1, APPOINTMENT AND
QUALIFICATIONS AUTHORIZING THE PARTICIPATION
IN THE CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION EXEMPTION
PROGRAM FOR ENTRY LEVEL LAW ENFORCEMENT
POSITIONS AND THE PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT OF
OFFICER(S).**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Belmar has found the need and has found it to be necessary and proper to amend Chapter 5 entitled Department of Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Belmar (“Borough”) is governed by N.J.S.A. 11A:1-1 et seq., the Civil Service Act, and the rules and regulations established pursuant the this act; and

WHEREAS, P.L.2021, c7 amended by P.L.2021, c406 provides for the Civil Service Commission to exempt a person from the requirement to take an examination for an entry level enforcement position provided the individual completes within the time frame provided for P.L. 2021, c. 406 a full Basic Course for Police Officers training course at a school approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police training Commission; and

WHEREAS, P.L.2021c.7 also provided that a municipal police department may hire a person exempt from the Civil Service requirement to take an examination for an entry-level law enforcement position upon adoption of a resolution by the governing body authorizing such hiring and the adoption of a conflict of interest and nepotism policies; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has previously established a nepotism policy posted and distributed to employees and to be contained in the Borough’s Employee Handbook and has a conflict of interest policy as provided in the Borough’s existing Employee Handbook; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended the Borough affirmatively “opt in” and authorize such hiring to provide for the selection of a qualified individual or qualified individuals who have or will have completed the necessary training required by the New Jersey Police Training Commission; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Belmar, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Borough of Belmar is hereby authorized to participate in the program to hire persons exempt from the Civil Service examination process for entry-level law enforcement positions provided the individual has successfully completed a full Basic Course for Police Officers training course at a school approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police Training Commission.
2. The Borough Administrator and Chief of Police are authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate participation in the Civil Service exemption program.
3. The Borough Clerk is directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Borough Administrator, Chief of Police, and the New Jersey Civil Service Commission.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Borough of Belmar, County of Monmouth, New Jersey that Chapter 5 entitled the Department of Public Safety, §5-2.2 entitled Appointment and Qualification is amended and supplemented as follows:

Section I. Chapter 5, Section 2.2 Appointment and Qualification shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

- 1) No Person shall be appointed to the Police Department who is not qualified as provided by the laws of the State of New Jersey including the Civil Service rules and regulations. Applicants seeking appointment to the Police Department shall successfully complete a physical, mental and psychological examination which examination shall be conducted in accordance with all applicable laws and administrative regulations of the State of New Jersey.
- 2) In accordance with P.L. 2021, c. 7 (N.J.S.A. 11A:4-1.3) individuals may be appointed to entry-level law enforcement positions in the Police Department without taking a competitive examination if they have successfully completed a full basic course for police officers training at a School approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police Training Commission.
- 3) All duly qualified applicants for the position of Borough of Belmar Police Officer shall be classified in the following classes:
 - a) Residents of the Borough of Belmar.
 - b) Other residents of Monmouth County.
 - c) Other Residents of the State of New Jersey.
 - d) All other qualified applicants.
- 4) All appointments to the position of Borough of Belmar Police Officer shall be made in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-123.1(a), with all those in Class A – Residents of the Borough of Belmar – to be appointed first, and then those in each succeeding class in the order above listed.
- 5) All applicants classified in Class A must be residents of the Borough of Belmar as of the announced closing date of the Civil Service Examination for the Position.

SECTION II. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudicated and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION III. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with the ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after final passage, adoptions and publication according to law.

BOND ORDINANCE REAPPROPRIATING \$735,800.46 EXCESS BOND PROCEEDS NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSES IN ORDER TO FINANCE THE COST OF VARIOUS MARINA INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY, AND REPEALING BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2022-19

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Belmar, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough") finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2015-22 on June 3, 2015, Bond Ordinance No. 2015-24 on July 7, 2015, and Bond Ordinance No. 2019-32 on November 6, 2019 (collectively, the "Bond Ordinances"); and

WHEREAS, the Bond Ordinances appropriated, inter alia, \$6,400,000 for the Lake Como Outfall Project, including a \$10,750 down payment, a \$1,504,250 debt authorization for such purpose, and anticipated grants in the amount of \$4,885,000 (after giving effect to the subsequent issuance of long-term debt); and

WHEREAS, following the effective dates of the Bond Ordinances, the Borough issued bonds in the amount of \$1,504,250 and received grants in the amount of \$4,104,147.27 in respect of the Lake Como Outfall Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the Lake Como Outfall Project has either been completed in full or discontinued as a result of events occurring subsequent to the adoption of the Bond Ordinances, as applicable; and

WHEREAS, there currently remains on deposit in the Borough capital accounts excess bond proceeds in the amount of \$735,800.46, which excess bond proceeds are allocable to the Lake Como Outfall Project portion of the Bond Ordinances (the "Excess Proceeds"), and which Excess Proceeds are no longer necessary to complete such improvements or purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough no longer anticipates receipt of the remaining \$780,852.73 of the \$4,885,000 in originally-anticipated grants in respect of the Lake Como Outfall Project, and by separate resolution the Borough Council intends to cancel such portion of the appropriation contained in the Bond Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with its statutory powers set forth in section 39 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"), the Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to finance the cost of various marina infrastructure improvements, for which improvements bonds may be issued, thereby, decreasing the amount of additional Borough debt to finance such current capital needs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now desires to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to undertake the cost of various marina infrastructure improvements for the Borough; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2022-19 finally adopted on October 4, 2022 (the “Prior Reappropriation Ordinance”), the Borough reappropriated the sum of \$1,480,853.18, which the Borough believed constituted available bond proceeds allocable to the Lake Como Outfall Project portion of the Bond Ordinances, in order to finance the cost of various marina infrastructure improvements; and

WHEREAS, the actual amount of such available bond proceeds has since been determined to be \$735,800.46, which amount is being reappropriated by this ordinance, and therefore the Borough Council now wishes to repeal the inconsistent Prior Reappropriation Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined that the aggregate amount of \$735,800.46 of the balance of the appropriation for capital purposes originally made available pursuant to the following Bond Ordinances of the Borough is no longer necessary for the purposes for which the obligation previously was authorized:

\$735,800.46	No. 2015-22 adopted June 3, 2015, as amended by No. 2015-24 adopted on July 7, 2015, as amended by No. 2019-32 adopted on November 6, 2019, providing for the Lake Como Outfall Project, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.
<u>\$735,800.46</u>	Total to be reappropriated to other capital purposes.

Section 2. The appropriation for the purposes in the amount set forth in Section 1 hereof is hereby canceled and reappropriated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39 to other capital purposes as set forth in Section 3 hereof.

Section 3. The aggregate amount of \$735,800.46, representing the amount referred to in Section 1 hereof, is hereby appropriated to provide for the following capital improvement purposes, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough, and the estimated cost of each project is as follows:

<u>\$735,800.46</u>	Marina infrastructure improvements for the Borough, including, but not limited to, electrical upgrades to various docks.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are property or improvements which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance is fifteen (15) years.

(c) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$150,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvement or purpose herein before described.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code, of the interest on all bond proceeds reappropriated by this bond ordinance.

Section 7. The Prior Reappropriation Ordinance is hereby repealed

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption.
