**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR AMENDING THE REVISED
GENERAL ORDINANCE CHAPTER 19: “TRAFFIC” TO CLARIFY CERTAIN
PARKING RESTRICTIONS**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Belmar, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that Chapter 19: “Traffic” of the Borough’s Revised General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows (~~stricken text~~ indicates deletions, underlined text indicates additions):

19-12 PARKING TIME LIMITED ON CERTAIN STREETS.

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit between the hours listed on any day (except Sundays and public holidays) upon any of the streets or parts of streets described.

<i>Name of Street</i>	<i>Sides</i>	<i>Time Limit</i>	<i>Hours</i>	<i>Location</i>
Tenth Avenue	Both sides of center island	2 hours	9:00 am to 6:00 pm <u>At all times</u> All days	From the westerly curbline of Main Street to the New York and Long Branch Railroad.
Tenth Avenue	Both sides of center island East	2 hours	At all times All days	From the westerly curbline of Main Street to a point 322 feet westerly therefrom.
Tenth Avenue	Both sides of center island West	10 hours	At all times All days	From the <u>New York and Long Branch Railroad to the easterly curbline of State Highway Route No. 35.</u> westerly curbline of Main Street to a point 352 feet westerly to a point approximately 502 feet west of Main Street.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portion of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to that end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this amending ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies only.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall be in full force and take effect twenty (20) days after final passage and publication, as required by law.
