Belmar Secures Grant to Complete Lake Como Project

Monmouth County has awarded the Borough of Belmar \$200,000 to complete the Lake Como project, allowing the path around the lake to be completed and a new fountain installed.

"We hear from residents all the time about this project, particularly those living in the south end of Belmar," said Councilwoman Caitlin Donovan. "We are thrilled to deliver this good news to them."

The path currently circles the lake, encompassing Lake Como and Spring Lake, but stopping at the Belmar border. The project will use the same materials for a continuous experience for those enjoying the lake.

A new fountain will also be installed, which will contribute to both the water quality and overall aesthetics of the lake.
